BILL PAYMENT AT THE OFFICE: Since July, water bills have been payable at the IWA office or by mail to P.O. Box H, Sanibel, Florida 33957. This change in procedure is working well, the staff finds that time is saved by having this function handled in-house, and the IWA cash position can be assessed on a daily basis. Thank you for your cooperation in making this change.

COMPUTERIZATION: About 6 months ago, IWA purchased a small computer to execute various administrative functions at the office. This machine decreases our dependence on outside services. At this time, our computer is processing monthly billings, accounts payable, payroll, monthly financial statements, mailing lists and route records.

E.D. PLANT MEMBRANES: Raw water feeding the electrodialysis plant is deteriorating. Efforts to stretch the well life have been rewarded by the installation of a new type of membrane, resulting in longer working periods, less down time, lower power usage and ability to process poorer quality well water.

CAPTIVA WATER MAIN: Materials are now on hand for the job. Patterson and Wilder, Inc. has begun the new 12" pipeline from Blind Pass to beyond the Captiva Fire Station, approximately 3 miles. Please be patient and remember that should you have any problems as a result of this project, call the contractor - 939-4646 or nighttime at 481-1858.

EQUIPMENT AND INVENTORY STORAGE: A master plan for IWA real properties is being drawn up. It will designate areas for large equipment storage, repair and maintenance shops, inventory storage, and parking. Where required, fencing will be erected to secure areas where chemical processes are located and for equipment protection. Construction of a storage building at the RO site is under consideration. Proper maintenance and security of the rolling stock and tangible assets of your utility company is an on-going project which is essential to economical operations.

BREAKING TOILETS: If your toilet's flushing valve sticks open, you waste four gallons a minute. That is 172,800 gallons per month or about \$435.00. Be sure the system is checked frequently.

AFTER HOURS EMERGENCIES: As you know, IWA is responsible for the water system from the meter at your property line back to the distribution source. If a problem arises after normal business hours, call 472-1502 or 472-3743 for assistance. If a problem arises within your property lines, places call your property lines.
