IN MEMORIAM, PETE WILSON...



Pete Wilson, who retired from IWA in 1998 as Production Manager, passed away on November 3, 2011 at the age of 75 in York, Pennsylvania. Pete worked for Island Water for

22 years, and was instrumental in getting our new RO Plant up and running in 1980. Pete was also a Navy veteran, having served during the Korean Conflict, Vietnam War, and the Cuban Missile Crisis. True to Navy tradition, Pete was known to instruct plant operators that "If it moves, salute it; if it doesn't move, paint it." To this day, our plant and equipment continues to be sharply maintained and painted.

IT'S BUDGET TIME AT IWA...



The Island Water Association was incorporated 46 years ago, in 1965, and franchised by Lee County as a member-owned, not-for-profit association. Our fiscal year is synonymous with the calendar year, which means it is now budget time at IWA. Our Department Managers are currently analyzing their needs for the up-coming year. The Revenues, Operations/Maintenance and Capital Budgets are being compiled in order to present them to the IWA Board of Directors for their approval.

Budgeting has always been a bit of an art in the

water utility business due to variables beyond our control, such as rainfall and seasonal visitors. Revenues should remain fairly steady at about \$6.5M, with O&M and Capital expenses estimated close to \$6.5M, as one would expect from a not-for-profit organization.

Included in the budgeting process is an estimate of 2012 Capital projects costs. Capital spending involves projects that maintain or upgrade IWA's infrastructure. Past examples of Capital spending include the recently completed upgrade of our product transfer line and the 2009 upgrade of the three product transfer pumps. Last year we replaced and upsized almost 2/3 of a mile of well line, along with the replacement of our aging distribution piping throughout the Sanibel Bayous subdivision. The largest Capital project budgeted for 2012 will be the replacement of aging thin-wall distribution pipe in the Dunes subdivision. The northern half of the Dunes will be upgraded in 2012, and the southern half is tentatively scheduled to be upgraded in 2013. These upgrades should be completed before the scheduled repaving of the Dunes roadways by the City of Sanibel. A project as extensive as this one requires months of planning and locating of existing water mains and other utilities. Residents will receive ample notification before work commences. Along with replacing the old with the new, IWA strives to realize future operating cost savings and increased efficiencies with every Capital project

In this day and age, budgeting has become even more challenging due to the increased volatility of the cost of energy, chemicals, employee medical insurance, and the overall state of the economy. It would be nice if we could predict the future; however if that was the case, we would probably all be retired drinking cool glasses of vintage 2011 IWA tap water on the beach!

LINDGREN BOULEVARD BOX CULVERT...



The City of Sanibel's construction project on Lindgren Boulevard to replace the aging box culvert is complete. IWA's eight inch main has been reinstalled, freshly repainted, and is back in service.

This pipe is one of numerous aqueous crossings which are defined as water mains running over open bodies of water, and they are usually attached to a bridge or culvert. The crossings all need periodic inspection, maintenance and repainting; so this is one crossing we can mark off the list.

If you noticed, the bridge is painted white, and our pipe is painted blue. This is to differentiate our distribution potable water piping, (blue) from other underground utility piping, such as reclaimed water from the City (purple), and City sewer piping (green) to prevent unintentional cross connections and contamination of our drinking water.

PRODUCT TRANSFER LINE AND DUCTILE IRON PIPE INSPECTIONS...

In our last issue of *IWA Pipeline* we discussed the product transfer line replacement and the need to uncover some 30-year-old ductile iron (DI) piping within the RO Plant yard for external corrosion evaluation. While the transfer pipe replacement was completed, DI pipes were uncovered in six different locations throughout the yard and prepared for visual inspections and sonic testing of wall thicknesses. These six locations were all visually excellent, with little visible corrosion. Sonic

testing further confirmed that wall thicknesses had not changed much in thirty years. The exposed areas of the pipe were coated with an epoxy paint and wrapped in plastic sheeting before being reburied, to prevent future corrosion of the test areas. We can probably thank the clean fill dirt in which the pipes were installed for their excellent condition.

RETURNING SNOW BIRDS ...


